ACCEPTANCE OF THE REGULATIONS

Registration for EPIC GRAN CANARIA implies that the participant has read, understood and fully accepts these Regulations, without prejudice to any specific contractual terms that may apply.

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ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE, NATURE OF THE EVENT AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

EPIC GRAN CANARIA is an international road cycling event consisting of two cyclosportive rides, held within the "Cycling for All" category of the Royal Spanish Cycling Federation (RFEC). It is conceived as a sporting activity for leisure, tourism and cultural purposes, with free-speed sections and a significant level of difficulty due to the distance and elevation gain.

Participation and individual effort are intended as a source of personal challenge and self-improvement. The event takes place on roads open to motor traffic; participants will therefore be considered normal road users and must comply at all times with traffic regulations and with the instructions of the authorities and the organiser.

The event shall be conducted in accordance with the regulations in force governing traffic and road safety, in particular Royal Legislative Decree 6/2015 of 30 October, approving the consolidated text of the Law on Traffic, Motor Vehicle Circulation and Road Safety, and Royal Decree 1428/2003 of 21 November, approving the General Traffic Regulations, especially Article 55 and Annex II concerning sporting events and cycling rides.

EPIC GRAN CANARIA is organised by Club Deportivo Procyclé, Tax ID G76262211, with the collaboration of Riu Hotels & Resorts, the Cabildo de Gran Canaria, Turismo de Gran Canaria, and the municipalities of San Bartolomé de Tirajana, Mogán and Santa Lucía.

ARTICLE 2. DATES, STAGES AND RACE NUMBER COLLECTION

The first stage will cover approximately 111 km and the second stage approximately 75 km. Both stages will start from the Hotel Riu Palace Maspalomas, located at the end of Avenida de Tirajana.

2.1. Collection and use of race number and timing chip

- To collect the race number, participants must present a national ID card or other identification document and, where applicable, an RFEC/FCC licence. If the participant does not hold a valid licence, they must have taken out the insurance or day licence provided by the organiser.
- Race numbers will not be issued outside the official collection hours.
- The race number and timing chip must be worn visibly and correctly positioned throughout the event. If the race number is folded or concealed on the handlebars or frame, the timing system may fail to record the participant's time correctly.
- The race number and timing chip are personal and non-transferable and may not be used by anyone other than the registered participant.
- A race number may be collected on behalf of another participant upon presentation of the original or a photocopy of the required documentation. Photographs of documents displayed on a mobile phone will not be accepted.
- Participants under 18 years of age must present authorisation signed by their legal guardian.
- If a valid federation licence is not presented, the €20 fee for the day insurance/licence will apply, as provided in these Regulations.

ARTICLE 3. TIMED SECTIONS AND CUT-OFF TIMES

The event will include three timed sections distributed across the two stages. Each section will have a maximum completion time and a cut-off time. Participants who exceed these limits must follow the instructions of the organiser and the broom wagon.

Participants who fail to reach the control points within the established times will be considered out of the event and must follow the organiser's instructions. The broom wagon will travel at the rear of the event and monitor compliance with the cut-off times.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

At 12:15 h the group will depart from the feed zone located at Pie de Cuesta. Any participant arriving at this point after 12:15 h will be removed from the route and will not be permitted to pass through the Mogán tunnel, and must follow the organiser's instructions.

ARTICLE 4. FEED ZONES

There will be food and drink feed zones at the end of each timed section. During Stage 1 they will be located at Mirador de Ayagaures and Plaza de Ayacata. During Stage 2, the feed zone will be located at the Centro Cultural Pancho Guerra, next to Plaza de Tirajana.

ARTICLE 5. CLASSIFICATIONS AND CATEGORIES

EPIC GRAN CANARIA will establish overall and category classifications, as well as an award for the largest team.

The participant's category will be determined by the age they turn during the 2027 calendar year.

Price: €75. For participants aged 15 to 16. Includes Welcome Pack, EPIC bottle and commemorative jersey for registrations completed by 9 November. Junior participants may only take part in Timed Sections 1 and 3.

Non-federated participants will be charged €20 for the day insurance/licence. Triathlon licences will not be valid for this purpose.

As a general rule, participants must be at least 18 years old. Cyclists aged 15, 16 and 17 may also participate with authorisation from their legal guardian and subject to the participation restrictions established in these Regulations. There is no maximum age for participation.

ARTICLE 7. REGISTRATION CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS

Participants will have the following options for cancelling their registration:

7.1. With refund insurance

A participant who purchases refund insurance may request a refund of the registration fee in the circumstances and under the conditions covered by that insurance. The cost of the insurance itself is non-refundable.

- If EPIC GRAN CANARIA cannot be held or must be postponed due to force majeure, a state of emergency, a weather alert or other circumstances beyond the organiser's control, the terms of the refund insurance purchased will apply.
- Up to 15 days before the event, a refund may be granted, subject to the insurance conditions, in duly documented cases of serious injury or illness, accident or death of the participant, their spouse or partner, or first-degree ascendants or descendants, as well as serious illness requiring hospitalisation or death of those family members.

ARTICLE 8. CYCLING LICENCE AND PARTICIPATION INSURANCE

To participate, it is mandatory to hold a valid cycling licence recognised by the Royal Spanish Cycling Federation (RFEC), or to purchase the day licence/insurance provided by the organiser. These are the forms of insurance accepted for participation. By completing registration, the participant declares that they are physically fit to undertake the event.

ARTICLE 9. REGISTRATION, TIMING AND INCLUDED SERVICES

Registration will only be considered valid once the registration fee has been paid. Payment will be made online by credit card through the Trackingsport payment platform.

Registrations are personal and non-transferable. Cancellations and, where applicable, refunds will be governed exclusively by Article 7. A registered participant may not be replaced by another person.

Registration includes a numbered bike plate, timing chip, Welcome Pack, physiotherapy service, feed zones, mechanical assistance under the terms established in these Regulations, medical service and Finisher diploma.

Timing will be carried out electronically using a chip. The system may classify as NOT CLASSIFIED any participant whose passage is not recorded at the established control points, including the start and finish, within the scheduled times.

ARTICLE 10. SUPPORT VEHICLES AND TOWING

Participants are strictly prohibited from being towed by any vehicle. Private accompanying vehicles that interfere with the normal running of the event are also prohibited, in accordance with traffic regulations and the instructions of the authorities. Breaches may be sanctioned by the organiser and, where applicable, by the competent law-enforcement authorities.

ARTICLE 11. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

During the event, the organiser will provide a medical support system comprising medical personnel, ambulances and mobile intensive care units (UVI), first-aid points, a medical post at the finish, a broom wagon and a physiotherapy service, in accordance with the event plan and authorisations.

ARTICLE 12. MECHANICAL ASSISTANCE

The organiser will provide mechanical assistance along the route, although this does not imply an obligation to attend to every mechanical failure or incident. Labour will be free of charge, while replacement parts will be paid for by the participant.

Only repairs that can be carried out on the route will be attended to. Punctures are excluded. The organiser may provide fixed assistance points and mobile assistance. All participants must carry their own basic spare parts and be self-sufficient. Mechanical assistance provided by the organiser is a courtesy service.

ARTICLE 13. MANDATORY EQUIPMENT AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY

- An approved cycling helmet must be worn throughout the event.
- Each participant must carry sufficient water and food to cover, at a minimum, the distance between the different feed zones, which may be approximately 50 km.
- Each participant must carry the basic equipment required to deal with minor mechanical problems and punctures.

ARTICLE 14. EVENT SAFETY

Traffic units from the Guardia Civil, Municipal Police, Civil Protection and other resources provided by the organiser will contribute to the safety of the event, without prejudice to each participant's individual obligations as a road user.

ARTICLE 15. TRAFFIC RULES

All participants must strictly comply with traffic and road-safety regulations. The event takes place on roads open to traffic, and each participant must obey road signs, the instructions of law-enforcement officers and the directions of the organiser.

Any participant who breaches traffic rules or compromises the safety of the event may be removed and sanctioned in accordance with these Regulations, without prejudice to any administrative penalties that may also apply.

ARTICLE 16. ACCEPTANCE AND PARTICIPANT RESPONSIBILITY

Acceptance of these Regulations is formalised at the time of registration for EPIC GRAN CANARIA. By registering, the participant declares that they have read the Regulations, are aware of their contents and accept the conditions of participation established herein.

Participation is undertaken under the participant's personal responsibility. Each participant must be covered by the corresponding federation licence or, if not federated, by the accident insurance/day licence provided by the organiser.

The participant is responsible for the care and safekeeping of their bicycle, equipment and personal belongings. The organiser will not be liable for loss, misplacement, theft, breakdown or damage, except where liability legally rests with the organiser.

ARTICLE 17. ORGANISATIONAL CHANGES AND RIGHT OF ADMISSION

The organiser reserves the right to modify schedules, routes, control points, services or other organisational aspects where justified by safety considerations, force majeure, administrative authorisations or operational requirements. Relevant changes will be communicated through the event's official channels.

The organiser reserves the right of admission in accordance with applicable law and may refuse or withdraw participation from anyone who breaches these Regulations, compromises safety or disrupts the normal running of the event.

ARTICLE 18. PARTICIPANT DECLARATION AND COMMITMENTS

By registering, the participant expressly declares and accepts the following:

- The participant is aware that EPIC GRAN CANARIA is a staged cyclosportive event.
- The participant declares that they are in an appropriate state of health to undertake the physical effort required to participate in a fondo or gran fondo event, depending on the route completed.
- The participant is responsible for the care and safekeeping of all equipment used in the event, including their bicycle, equipment and personal belongings.
- The participant undertakes to comply with traffic regulations and to safeguard their own safety and that of other participants and road users.

- The participant undertakes to exercise particular caution in the presence of vehicles, unforeseen circumstances, hazardous sections, long descents, bends and areas where road conditions may require special attention.
- The participant is aware that some tunnels may not have sufficient lighting and undertakes to exercise particular caution and follow the instructions of the organiser and the authorities.
- The participant acknowledges that cycling involves inherent sporting risks and assumes responsibility arising from their own conduct, without prejudice to any liability that may legally correspond to third parties or the organiser.

ARTICLE 19. VIOLATIONS, PENALTIES AND DISQUALIFICATION

The following conduct, among others, may result in a penalty or disqualification:

- Failure to comply with traffic regulations.
- Overtaking the lead police vehicle when expressly prohibited.
- Failure to comply with instructions from the security forces or the organiser.
- Failure to pass through the established control points.
- Discarding waste or damaging the environment.
- Using unauthorised support vehicles.
- Being towed by a vehicle.
- Any conduct that compromises safety or the normal running of the event.

The above conduct may result in immediate disqualification and, in serious or repeated cases, a ban from participating in future editions, without prejudice to any penalties that may be imposed by the competent authorities.

ARTICLE 20. SAFETY AND CONTROL SUPPORT PERSONNEL

The organiser may appoint participants or support personnel whose role is to contribute to the control and safety of the event. Such personnel may report to the organiser any conduct contrary to these Regulations. Reports will be assessed by the organiser in order to determine any appropriate measures.

ARTICLE 21. AMENDMENTS TO THE REGULATIONS, ROUTES AND ANNEXES

EPIC GRAN CANARIA may introduce changes due to organisational requirements, administrative authorisations, safety considerations, route requirements or other justified circumstances. Amendments to these Regulations and their annexes will be published on the official website, www.epicgrancanaria.com, which will be the reference channel for consulting the current version.

ARTICLE 22. IMAGE RIGHTS

Image rights. Acceptance of these Regulations necessarily implies that the participant authorises the organisers of EPIC GRAN CANARIA to record all or part of their participation in the event, agrees that their image may be used for the promotion and dissemination of EPIC GRAN CANARIA in all forms (radio, press, video, photography, DVD, internet, posters, media, etc.), and assigns all rights relating to any commercial and advertising use that the organisers may consider appropriate, without any entitlement to financial compensation. This article also applies to photographs.

ARTICLE 23. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

Personal data provided by participants will be processed by Club Deportivo Procycle for the purposes of managing registration, organisation, safety, timing, classifications, operational communications and any other actions necessary in connection with participation in EPIC GRAN CANARIA.

Data may be disclosed to collaborating entities or service providers where necessary for the proper management of the event and always in accordance with applicable data-protection legislation.

Commercial or promotional communications that are not necessary for managing participation will be carried out on the appropriate legal basis and, where consent is required, such consent must be obtained specifically, freely, on an informed basis and in a revocable manner.

Participants may exercise their rights of access, rectification, erasure, objection, restriction of processing and data portability, where applicable, by contacting info@epicgrancanaria.com.

ARTICLE 24. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Participants must respect the natural environment through which the event passes at all times. It is strictly prohibited to discard wrappers, bottles, gel packaging, inner tubes, waste or any other object outside the areas designated by the organiser. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.

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
